2008 CotY Award – Residential Kitchen over \$100k

Project Description for PR purposes

This 1960's house featured a small kitchen with peninsula, misaligned basement and 2nd floor narrow stairs, a disconnected dining room, inadequate lighting and poor traffic flow.

The kitchen floor plan was opened up by aligning the basement stairs with the 2nd floor stairs, widening the family room archways, removing a partition wall between the kitchen and dining room and providing an eat-in lunch bar. An existing closet under the stairs was retained, providing the owner with a place to put books. The kitchen was gutted and electric and plumbing supplies were completely upgraded. More natural light was provided by replacing the window over the sink with a wider, taller window unit and replacing the dining room triple windows. Work started in October 2006 and was completed in 17 weeks.
